Background

According to a recent CDC report, overall overdose fatalities increased by more than 30% from 2019 to 2020.

Rates increased to an even greater extent for African Americans (44%) and for American Indian and Alaska Native people (39%).

While rates among people who are White, Hispanic, Asian or Pacific Islander all increased by about 22%.

Yearly overdose fatalities surpassed 108,000 during the 12-month period ending in February 2022.

FORE convened a series of discussions with experts to better understand challenges affecting opioid use disorder prevention, treatment, harm reduction and recovery services.

What emerged was the importance of funding community-driven OUD programs through community-based organizations.





To help CBOs enhance their ability to deliver services addressing the opioid crisis, particularly in hardest hit communities.

CBOs have the trust of those they serve and understand what it takes to reduce barriers to opioid use disorder prevention, treatment, and recovery, yet they struggle to find flexible funding needed to strengthen capacity and build key partnerships.

FORE is aiming to support a cohort of CBOs who can use capacity building funds to <u>enhance and expand the services they</u> <u>provide in their community to address OUD and Overdoses.</u>

To provide grant support that enhances community-based organizations' ability to deliver services addressing the opioid crisis, particularly in communities where people are at greatest risk of developing opioid use disorder and overdose deaths.

<u>Award</u>: up to \$75,000/year for up to two years <u>RFP Open</u>: August 24 – October 21, 2022



Funding Opportunity: Target Projects

Funding is for specific activities or projects designed to strengthen an organization's operations, leadership, technology, programmatic, and administrative capacity to achieve sustainable Opioid Use Disorder mitigation initiatives. 11

Requests may actualize one or more of the following or may propose other activities:

- **Conduct Organizational Assessments** to identify needs and design a plan to increase organizational effectiveness that will help meet current challenges, overcome barriers, and result in intentional and productive enhancements in OUD service delivery..
- Enhance Operational Effectiveness to improve productivity and organizational functioning in areas such as administration, finance, human resources, and technology.



Funding Opportunity: Target Projects

• **Strengthen Communication** efforts to raise awareness about an organization's mission and attract attention and resources to the organization.

- **Expand and Stabilize Resources** to develop financial stability by increasing the CBO's ability to develop necessary resources and plan for longer-term sustainability, including the ability to apply for foundation, corporate support and/or government funding streams.
- Strengthen and Evaluate Programming to enhance access and delivery of OUD services to more individuals and families in their communities.
- Foster Collaborations with a broader range of allies i.e., child welfare, women and families, education, workforce, law enforcement, criminal justice, and primary and behavioral health entities to strengthen community engagement that results in stronger and expanded services.

Proposals must demonstrate how the requested activities and funds would lead to improved services and outcomes with respect to some aspect of OUD/OD.



Funding Opportunity: Eligibility

- This funding opportunity is <u>limited</u> to Community-Based Organizations.
- Academic institutions, healthcare systems, and national organizations are ineligible, though may partner with a CBO provided CBO is the lead applicant.
- Applicant organizations must be a 501(c)3 organization (or non-profit with appropriate 501(c)3 fiscal sponsor).
